#### 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Plant Sale Fundraiser

Every year, WCG hosts a fundraiser connecting community members with plants for their gardens, all while raising money for the many programs that we oversee! This year marks WCG's 30<sup>th</sup> year of helping our community produce healthy food for their families, and we want you to be part of the "Best Little Plant Sale in Utah!"

This year, it will be held on Saturday, May 11<sup>th</sup> in the parking lot at Rowland Hall (720 S Guardsman Way, SLC). We'll be transforming this pavement into a paradise featuring over 70 varieties of tomatoes, as well as annual vegetables, flowers, perennials, and more!

Help us with unloading trucks full of plants grown by WCG staff and participants, event set-up, as well as selling and stocking plants.

All volunteers are granted access to the invitation-only pre-sale on Friday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, from 5:30 – 8pm. You'll get first pick of all the amazing varieties available, to purchase in advance for your own garden. If you are volunteering on Friday, we ask that you have a friend or family member shop in your place as we may not be able to send you on a long break.

### Green Team Farm

The Green Team Farm has ongoing needs for volunteers. Orientation is held on Wednesday mornings from March through September. <u>Sign-up</u> <u>for your orientation date today!</u>

Once orientation is completed, volunteers are invited to participate with the crew and will have access to all farm-based volunteer roles. Most take place Tuesday through Thursday from 9:30am - 2pm.

Jump in with us as we raise the seedlings for the Plant Sale, plant and harvest crops for seed, weeding, mulching, composting, and trellising.

No farm or garden experience required. This is a great chance to learn!



# **Compost Club**

Get hands-on experience with the art of composting! This weekly club will teach the basics of composting, from building your recipe, balancing your green and brown inputs, understanding the breakdown process, and knowing when this "black gold" is ready to go into the garden!

Compost club is held at the Green Team Farm (622 W 100 S, SLC) every Tuesday at 2:00pm from April through October.

Come prepared to get dirty and build a compost pile. Closed toed shoes, gloves, and an adventurous mindset are a must!
