POSITION TITLE:	Garden Crew
POSITION DESCRIPTION:	Garden Crew is a small volunteer group (ranging 3-10 people) who are interested in learning about organic gardening through hands-on gardening practices. Responsibilities could include but are not limited to: weeding, double-digging, mulching, art projects, planting, harvesting, cleaning out plots, small-scale art projects, painting, etc.
IDEAL VOLUNTEER:	Garden Crew is ideal for students who need to complete service learning hours, community service hours, or individuals who are interested in furthering their hands-on gardening experience.

LENGTH OF COMMITMENT:	Volunteers can commit to the Garden Crew on a weekly basis, as their schedules allow. Minimum hour commitment: 1 hour (weekly crews might be 2- hours long. Volunteers are excused when the work is done.)
DATES NEEDED:	Tentative 2017 Schedule: Summer School Garden Crews - Every other Wednesday night: 6-8pm 5.13.17 - 8.23.17* Fall School Garden Crews - Every other Wednesday night: 4-6pm 9.6.17 - 11.1.17* <i>* Dates are subject to change</i>
LOCATION OF VOLUNTEER WORK:	TBD, based on garden needs, but will primarily be located in Salt Lake County.
REQUIREMENTS:	18 years old; Younger than 18 must be accompanied with an adult or have prior WCG approval Must sign in and out of volunteer logs Volunteers should watch weather report to determine appropriate clothing. It is recommended that volunteers should wear layers, closed-toe shoes, hat, sunscreen. Volunteers should also bring a bandana, water & refillable water bottle, and food/snacks.
QUALIFICATIONS:	Specific knowledge/ skills are not required; however, volunteers should come prepared to get dirty, do physical labor, and be comfortable working in a garden environment.
TRAINING PROVIDED:	Project specific training at the beginning of each garden crew night.
MISSION RELATED:	School Gardens are ran by teachers and faculty who work full time and take care of their families full time, in addition to maintaining these gardens for their students each year. By providing a resource of volunteers to these gardens, we are able to assist the teachers/students in growing and eating more healthy, organic, local food.
