What does it mean to be a WCG Ambassador?

What Wasatch Community Gardens expects from our Ambassadors:

- We expect ambassadors to be active in understanding who Wasatch Community Gardens is and what we do.
- You are responsible for executing the lessons that have been provided. Wasatch Community Gardens is happy to provide initial start-up equipment and on-going support via email, but you will be expected to teach the monthly lessons and maintain your classroom garden bed independently.
- You are responsible for returning the feedback sheets.
- You are responsible for providing at least 2-3 photos per month of your classroom executing the lesson plans.
- Be aware of the community if other teachers or colleagues ask about your work in the garden or about how to be involved, try to be approachable and know how to connect them to Wasatch Community Gardens.
- You are responsible for working with the School Garden Director to set up two meetings per year a start of year orientation and an end of year review.
- Because we strive to work with a wide variety of teachers and students, you will be responsible for completing a very basic demographic sheet for your school and classroom. Individual demographics will be kept confidential and will only be used in aggregate for reporting purposes.
