Position Title:	Chicken Crew
Position	Chicken Crew volunteers are assigned one day of week to check on the chickens located at the Grateful Tomato Garden.
Description:	Responsibilities include refilling water/food dishes, providing scratch October through May, deep cleaning water/food dish, general cleaning of coop, watching the chickens to see how the chickens are socializing, reporting any concerns or issues, snow shoveling to ensure access during winter months to the coop and run. Volunteers are encouraged to provide some veggie scraps at each visit (helps with bonding and is good for them). Volunteers are rewarded with eggs on their assigned day and are encouraged to attend all chicken-related workshops (offered free-of-charge as a benefit) during the term of their volunteer service.
Ideal Volunteer:	Chicken Crew is the most coveted volunteer crew. It is an ideal volunteer opportunity for individuals who demonstrate a long-term commitment to the organization, like working with livestock, and those interested in learning about chicken keeping basics.

Dates Needed:	Volunteers are assigned to days based on availability; Volunteers should complete chicken crew responsibilities on their assigned day prior to dusk so as not to disturb the chickens while they're roosting.

Qualifications:	Specific knowledge/ skills are not required.
Training Provided:	Volunteers will be provided with a detailed basic chicken care training session before beginning their assigned days.
Mission Related:	The chickens are used for educational and inspirational purposes for Wasatch Community Gardens' educational programs.
